Hi Eagles. It's been a pretty busy month in that my wife and I have been taking my mother to numerous appointments at the UW Neurology Clinic to prepare for a test procedure to find if draining excess water on her brain could help with her walking problem. Currently mom is in Karmenta Nursing Home because she needs more one on one assistance than her assisted living facility can provide to keep her safe. Her lower extremities are strong but she doesn't have the motor function to move and consequently she falls often. In addition I have been driving my wife to various appointments for a sleep disorder and her Parkinson's problem. On many days she is very uncomfortable driving. A sleep study showed she is getting no REM sleep and that's why she is so tired during the day. The sleep doctor feels it is caused by the various meds she is taking for the Parkinson's. She has also been having pain, tingling, and numbness in both hands. When so many doctors are involved for numerous conditions we don't know where to start. She chose her Parkinson's doctor and he did nerve testing on both hands and is convinced she has Carpel Tunnel in both hands and will require surgery. He also adjusted her medication scheduling such that it should eventually correct the sleep problem. Whew! Just keep praying for my mom, my wife, and lastly me.

I attended my first Plastic Modelers meeting last Tuesday since I used to host them at the Gallery of Aviation. One of the members who bought a P-51 weathervane from the museum has agreed to help me get the pipe welded up and install the red Gallery of Aviation Corsair at St. Peter Catholic Church as a memorial to my dad. You may recall this Corsair is the one I finished for my dad and he got to see about two weeks before he died. Dad's desk was in front of the window overlooking the installation and that is where Father Nilles of that parish gave dad the Sacrament of the Sick as he looked at the Corsair. Father Nilles was quite moved when I originally proposed putting the Corsair in the church garden area. Now that the weather has cooled down I will bring the Corsair home and clean it up for its final home. We hope to have it installed in the next couple of weeks and I will keep you posted. This is the very last item that is yet at the house we sold.

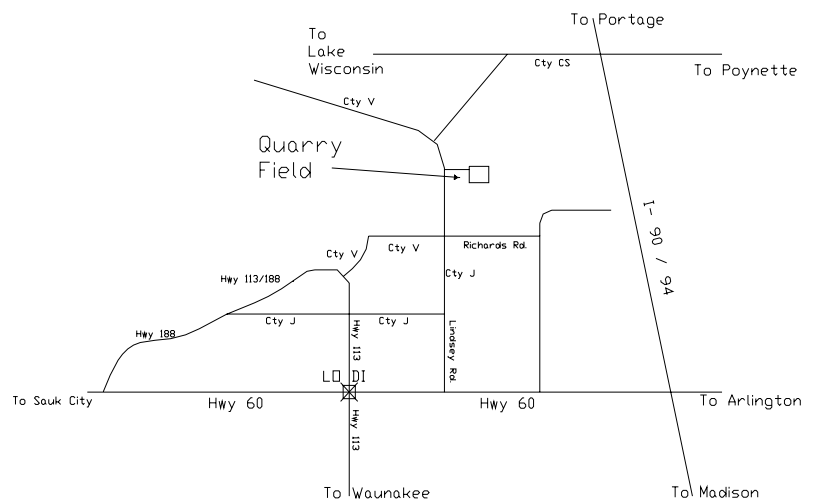
There will also be a pilots only raffle.
